Students can choose from more than 25 student organizations and more than 13 intramural sports. They can keep fit at the Rhodes Perrin Rec Center, the newlyrenovated 70,000-square-foot recreation facility, cheer on the Chaps or Lady Chaps (including LCU's 2008 national champion women's softball team, 2009 national champion baseball team, and three-time, back-to-back defending national champion women's basketball team). ATHLETICS

After competing for years with much success and 14 national championships at the NAIA level, Lubbock Christian University transitioned to Division II in 2015 and the women's basketball team promptly won the 2016 national championship in their first full season in Division II. They were champions again in 2019 and for the third time this spring. The 2019 team also had the second-highest GPA (3.77) in all of Division II, and the 2021 team had a combined GPA of 3.82 as of December. This is what it means to be a student-athlete at LCU and Chaparral fans can take much pride in the values and competitiveness of LCU athletics.

Preferred Qualities and Qualifications

Lubbock Christian University seeks a visionary leader who will champion its mission to transform the hearts, minds, and hands of students for lives of service and purpose.

Reporting directly to the President, the Chief Financial Officer will lead all financial operations of the institution, including the development of short and long-term financial and operational strategies to meet the challenging trends in higher education. Serving as a member of the Senior Leadership Team, he or she will assist the President in the active management of the institution and perform specific duties as prescribed by the President or the Board of Trustees. System responsibilities include budgeting, accounting, and reporting for all operations; information technology and the institution's ERP system; investment of operating and endowment funds; and capital projects and maintenance programs.

The institution includes three colleges and two schools with an enrollment in 2020 of 1664 truly exceptional students, with 15% of the student body who are full time students in the Honors College. Central to the university are genuinely dedicated faculty and staff who consider themselves co-discoverers—committed to creating a lasting impact beyond the campus.

Primary and Essential Functions

Lead day-to-day business operations and evaluate resource allocation alternatives, ensuring the President is appropriately informed on all financial matters.

Provide leadership to the financial and business operations of Lubbock Christian University including forecasting, strategic planning, asset and risk management, maintaining and improving banking and treasury relationships, financial statement preparation, insurance programs, reporting compliance, internal controls and investment management.

THE OPPORTUNITY

Major Duties

- Participate in the development of the University's strategic plans, programs, and initiatives projecting expected outcomes, financially and operationally.
- Serve as the primary contact for the Resource and Investment Committee of the Board, ensuring Board authorizations are received as needed. Examples include Annual Budget approvals, Tuition increases, asset sales, and audit results.
- Oversees the University's system of accounts and records on all University transactions and assets, ensuring control systems, planning tools and reporting mechanisms are in place to maintain accurate and healthy financial outcomes.
- Coordinates and directs the preparation of the budget, financial and cash forecasts.
- Furnishes internal and external reports as necessary, but more broadly providing the organization and its management with necessary financial and operating information.
- Establishes major economic objectives and policies for the institution and prepares reports that outline the University's financial position in the areas of income, expenses and earnings based on past, present and future operations.
- Among the duties of this position are management reporting and policy making as it pertains to Accounting, Student Business Office, ChapStore, Post Office, Payroll and Human Resources, and Risk Management/Real Estate.
- In cooperation with Admissions and Financial Aid, maintain standards and procedures governing financial relations with students for the payment of tuition and other charges, including student loans, scholarships, and deferred payments.
- Provides technical and analytical guidance in identifying and solving problems.
- Prepares regular financial statements for the University and assists in the external audit.
- Effectively monitor the performance of external investment managers and provide institutional leadership for growing the Universities investments.
- Approval authority for extending an offer of employment, may advise in decisions determining terminations and makes recommendations for promotions, reassignments or pay increases within the area of Financial Affairs.
- Assumes other special activities and responsibilities as required.

Required Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

Education and Experience

Minimum of Bachelor's degree, preferably in Finance, Business Administration, Accounting or Economics. CPA preferred.

Two (2) years recent experience as a Controller or a minimum of five (5) years of experience that is directly related to the specified duties and responsibilities gained through increasingly responsible positions within planning and management of financial operations.
